Diploma Exit Options

Students may choose to exit the program with one of the following diplomas, based on the number of credits completed:

- Diploma in Business Management: Awarded upon completion of 60 credit hours (typically after Year 2).
- Higher Diploma of Finance: Awarded upon completion of 90 credit hours, including 18 credits in General Studies, 6 credits in Apprenticeship, and 21 credits in the specialization (typically after Year 3).
